

I gave this book to my four year old grandson for his birthday. It was an immediate hit. First of all, he was enthralled with the British words sprinkled throughout the book, and especially the word "rubbish". The illustrations don't miss a step about where the rubbish goes and what happens next. There are plenty of flaps to see inside the machines, etc. This book inspired a family visit to the local recycling plant for a tour. You will not be disappointed with this wonderful book.

I have several of these Usborne "see inside" books and this one is the best. It goes into great detail about how the garbage (rubbish) is separated, recycled and reused. The middle of the book has a fold out with a huge illustration (including flaps) of what happens in a sorting plant. Very informative! My 4 and 6 year old boys love it, but this could easily keep an older child entertained for hours with all of the many flaps and interesting information included. It also covers waste treatment, composting and creating energy from the gases released by rotting garbage under the soil in landfills and in incinerators. EVERYTHING you need to know about garbage!Five Stars!Other good ones from this series is "See Under the Ground" and "See inside your Body".
