

To the Survivors was a powerful book written by a voice that is often not heard from: the rape crisis center's volunteer. It was interesting to hear of how he was received by some of the victims/survivors. Reading the accounts from several of the survivor speakers that worked with The Healing Place over the years was powerful. The mentions of the statistics being grossly underestimated is so true and on par with my own experience. I am a survivor and speaking out for the first time has led me to realize how many people I know in my life that have experienced sexual assault. I really was moved by reading Shira and Tim's experiences. Tim is the perfect example of how far reaching the crime of sexual assault. It hurts the victims and the ones that love them the most. When he talked about teaching his sons that no means no and to be respectful of women, I wish more taught their sons that and had that kind of a conversation with them. Rebecca said in the book: "I didn't tell you my story to get sympathy; I told you my story to show you that it does happen." This is so true and it solidifies what is mentioned throughout this book that conversations need to happen, when victims/survivors are ready. This book was filled with hope, and at times triggering, but well worth the read. I would recommend this book to victims, survivors, and the people who love them. One line that really stuck out to me and I wholeheartedly agree: "There is no timetable to grow and heal, and growth and healing is different for every survivor." followed along with them for several years now. They do indeed help. I've only read the blogs and interacted online. I knew the book would possibly trigger me. I'm glad I stuck it out. The author is really candid and open. Different people tell their stories in the book. While it was hard, it was also really hopeful for me. Most of them have learned to live with this awful thing very successfully. The author was clear and concise.
