

4.5 stars! After basically years of seeing this series around and reading about this mystical Roarke, I gave in and decided to read the In Death Books. It was quite an undertaking, since when I started there were 33 books already released in the series, not counting short stories and novellas. Besides that, deciding to read this series was a big commitment in two fronts. One, I simply had to buy 33 books and secondly, I would not be reading anything else until I was done. That's how psychotic I can be when it comes to book series. December 2011 was when my journey began and by February 2012 I was done and now there is NO turning back. I am IN LOVE with this series! I not only obviously love Roarke, but I love Eve and all the secondary characters that make up this great story as well. Yes, I have become irritated with Eve at times, but I adored being able to see her grow

throughout the series. It has been quite a ride, but one I will never regret hopping aboard. This series is a great mix of mystery, police drama and romance. I love every aspect of it, from the near futuristic setting, to the way J.D. Robb writes her prose. If there is one thing that bothers me, is that considering the series has 35 books published, the span of time that has passed is very short and I wish the lapse between books was a bit longer. But if you read the books throughout a longer period of time, it won't really matter, but reading them so close together made me wish for that longer lapse. Eve is such a complex character. All that she has been through has made who she is, but her story is not less heartbreakingly because of it. For that matter, so is Roarke's and the fact that these two found each other is nothing less than serendipity. They need each other and I am sure they would never have grown to be who they are in the series by book 35, if not for each other's presence in their lives. Not to mention the "family" they have built with their dear friends. One of the biggest issues brought up in this series by J.D. Robb, is the Nature Vs. Nurture debate. I love it! It always makes me think and it is very satisfying to see these people that could have become something very wrong, rise above nature and blood, to become amazing people. On the crime fighting aspect of the series, I find that Robb uses two types of narrative. Sometimes she carries more of a "Monk" style, where the perpetrator is clear if not early on, but soon. The other one is where we get a punch in the face when we finally find out who it is. I really enjoy that she doesn't have only one style, since that always keeps me guessing =DI LOVE this series and if you have yet to check it out, please do so! The first few books might not compel you completely, but keep reading! You won't regret it!

Outstanding. The most evil of villains juxtaposed with.....well that would tell, wouldn't it? I've seen it written, dozens of times, "this series just keeps getting better." But, you know what? This series just keeps getting better, and better. I missed some of the sparkling repartee I've come to expect between Peabody and Dallas, but in a novel brimming with poignant moments between Eve and Roarke, I'm not complaining. When he looks at her and says (not a spoiler, you could figure this out) to her that there is absolutely nothing he would not sacrifice for her, I melted. His words made me hear my husband's words, not spoken as eloquently as Roarke's but spoken just the same that he would sacrifice whatever necessary for our family. And Eve, Eve is so flawed, but she just keeps plugging, like most of us. That's what we rabid J.D. Second or third time I've read this, each time I am impressed with the nuances of the plot. Robb is

thorough and meticulous in her design of a book. I frequently reread her work just to see the things I miss going through the book again. Sound silly to reread her work, but I enjoy the interplay between her and the others. Although I enjoy sexual scenes in a lot of books, I have to admit, I frequently skip the sexual scenes here, I don't know why, but I don't enjoy them.

Yes there was violence in the way that the murders were committed. But other than that it was a great story to read. You felt sorry for the widow and the families left behind. But I was shocked when I read who the killer was. I was not prepared for that. I know that there is a reason for IAB but there are times you want to reach into the story and throttle their necks. This is one of them. To keep vital information away from Eve and from solving this case was not a good idea. But it all comes together with Eve solving the case. What I really like about these stories, especially if you have your favorites is that you can read them out of order. True, it's a series and to keep up with the characters, read them in order. I really do not feel sorry for the bad guys in this book because they truly get what they deserve. To use Roarke's business and some of his employees they way they did....well, they got what they deserved and justly as well. If I've learned anything from reading these stories, Eve and Roarke are not perfect and they do have their arguments and that's what makes it so entertaining on the reading. Eve getting her metaphores mixed up all of the time and everyone having to correct her is hillarious. Enjoy reading this book. You won't regret it.
