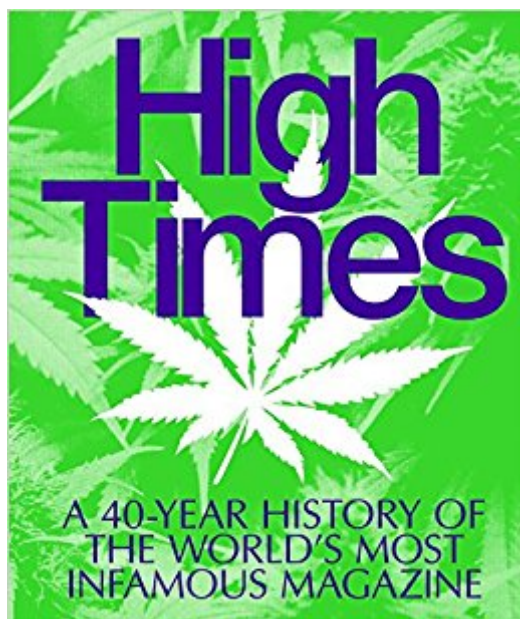

For four decades, High Times has been synonymous with marijuana in both pot and pop culture circles. In the past five years, the magazine has been the subject of feature stories in The New York Times, Washington Post, New York magazine, and more. The magazine is still published monthly and High Times also runs a popular website, where they host podcasts, videos, and articles. High Times also sponsors the Cannabis Cup. Held annually in Amsterdam since 1988, the Cannabis Cup is world's largest marijuana event. In 2013, 28 coffeeshops competed for the title of world's best cannabis, vying for the favor of over 3,000 judges from around the world.

A more accurate name for this would be 40 years of Magazine Covers! Why Bother

I was disappointed with this. It was a gift I bought for someone. It's a book of the magazines covers; that's it.

This is a painfully poor rendering of what could have been a fascinating and historic book. The photos of the magazine covers are very small--just a few inches by a few inches. They are so small you can barely read the words on the covers--insanely diminishing the value of the image. There are typically only three images per page. So, that means that a high percentage (60%+) of the page is

blank. Why are the images so diminutive when there is so much extra space to accommodate a larger image?? It's a horrible squandering of space and potential, and the layout of the images is very uncomfortable to the eye. This is the type of dull-witted mismanagement that gives stoners a bad name. And, if you are looking for a substantive history, be advised there is very little text here (and what is here is lime green--so washed-out you can hardly read it, and augmented by washed-out glaring lime green images). Small photos, presented with a lack of geometric balance or harmony, with sparse, washed-out text = No reason to have this book. I can see Tea Partiers or other ultra-conservative bumpkins using this book as Exhibit One as to what losers marijuana smokers are. This is conclusive evidence that stoner elites are dysfunctional. This is the Ford Pinto or Chevy Vega of book publication. If the ballot initiatives attempting to legalize marijuana in Alaska and elsewhere fail next week, I'm blaming this book. It's that bad. If everyone did their jobs as badly as the people who produced this book, America would spontaneously implode and disappear from the universe, and North Korea would be having their way with our women and real estate. The cover is made of thick cardboard where the edges are unfinished--you can see the grey cardboard inside. The edges of the cover are flush with the edges of the pages--thus there is no protection for the edges of the pages, which is the entire point of a cover. I don't know if they were going for a minimalist/mod Ikea-type vibe here or what, but this Made-in-China book basically looks primitively home-made. It's an amateur effort at best in every way. As a book collector, I buy a lot of books, and I very rarely send any back. In particular, I love buying books of the counter-culture genre. But this is so poorly done that I almost feel like I have to send it back as a matter of principle. This book was not inexpensive. At this quality level this book is almost worthless. It's really a shame, since some of the iconic High Times covers would have been very appealing had they been the size of the original covers, or at least large enough to appreciate. The High Times legacy deserved far better treatment than this. Taschen could have done a killer book on the High Times story, but we can immediately see that this "Powerhouse Books" is not Taschen. Like the earlier reviewer said, we will have to wait for some other book to come along and tell the story better.
