

This beautiful story is so full of life and love, or the search for love and acceptance within a seemingly fractured family set primarily at summer camp. Full of mystery and surprise On Blackberry Hill is ultimately moving and funny. Full of identifiable real characters finding their place in the world. I loved it. A perfect read year 'round but especially during the Summer.

A beautiful, affecting story that stayed with me long after I finished reading it. Though marketed as a young adult novel, the novel's elegant structure and deep meditations on love, loss, loyalty, spirituality, feminism, and the ties that bind us in friendship and in family dynamics (between sisters, between parents and rebellious children, between in-laws, to name only a few) is certain to appeal to adults, whether they've spent any time in a Jewish sleepaway camp (the story's main setting, and, one could argue, a character in and of itself) or not. I read the entire book in one fell swoop, on a long afternoon, and thoroughly enjoyed my visit to Camp Tovah in the process.
