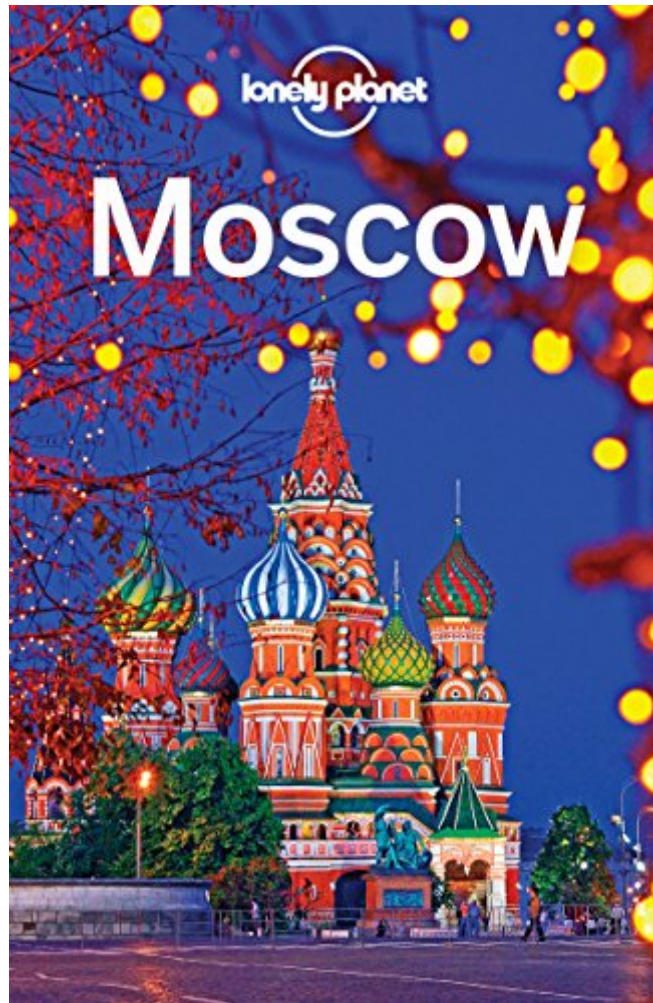

This looks to be a very helpful book.

Although there are some usable things in this "new" LP Moscow guide, there is no real update here, just a new cover and date on this edition. A few prices have been changed, though it is still inaccurate in areas such as public transportation. It is obvious that the researchers have not been there in some time. The first glaring error I saw in glancing through the "See Inside" online pages is that on page 18, LP instructs the reader to hail a taxi by waving down any passing car and negotiating a price!! Indeed we all used to travel that way in Moscow, but gypsy cabs (or just people willing to make a little extra cash) were declared illegal in 2011, and earlier in St. Petersburg. If a LP reader tried this, they would be breaking the law and incurring a fine if caught, as would the driver of the car. Wake up LP!! And don't insult us by pretending this is a "new edition"! Isn't there a law against misrepresenting your product?? What else have you not updated? Or rather, did you really update anything except raise a few prices that you could easily find on internet?

This is pretty lousy guide book. The maps and keys are maddening. It is really hard to cross reference the stuff on the maps with the descriptions in the book, and the maps have really poor detail. The author's choices about what stuff to see reflect a rather superficial knowledge of culture and history. If all you want to do is go to clubs and hip restaurants, maybe this is for you, but if you

want good advice for seeing historical sites, get something else.

Not a ton to go on here. Made for the casual tourist. Lacking maps which are large enough to incorporate their suggestions. A lot of good history, but otherwise, it's covers what feels like the tip of the iceberg. I haven't used it for much more than the history. Moscow could use a SOLID guide book as the culture and the means of getting around (for a north american like me) is not always easy to navigate if you don't speak the language. I'm a long time Lonely Planet user and this one falls flat.

Pretty disappointing. The travel literature on Moscow is fairly thin in comparison to Western and Central Europe, so I took a chance with this one. The book contains a decent list of attractions, restaurants, etc, but it is VERY light on practical information and tips to make the visit go smoothly. I've used the Rick Steeves' books several times and the logistical advice he gives can make the trip very easy. I've found myself closing this book and searching online at TripAdvisor and the like for help.

A useful guide for those completely unacquainted with Moscow and its surroundings. Somewhat outdated though, and could use refreshing.
