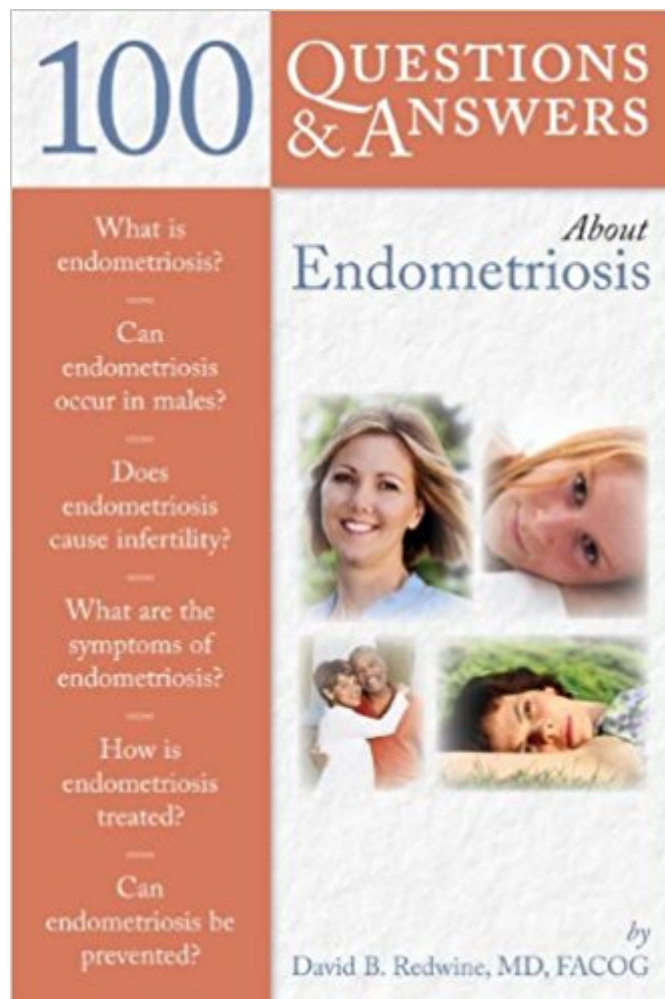

Dr. Redwine's proposed solution is so simple, yet not many doctors have the knowledge nor skills to provide millions of endo sufferers permanent relief. He debunks many of the theories of the endo causes: retrograde menstruation (yick!) being the most prominent. Instead, his one third of a century

researching this disease came up with one conclusion: women are born with the lesions already outside their bodies! How controversial is that! I'm certain most doctors who teach and treat this disease will strongly deny that this is the case. Dr. Redwine has found, and so have other researchers, that the only way to treat this disease without repeat visits to the doctor is to use a laparoscopy and excise (literally, cut out) the disease from the body. Sounds simple? Well, the problem is that only about half a dozen doctors in the US have the expertise to effectively use this technique. There needs to be a revamping of how medical schools train future doctors and get them on board to learn how to a) identify any and all lesions and b) how to excise them in such a way that none of the disease is left in the body.
