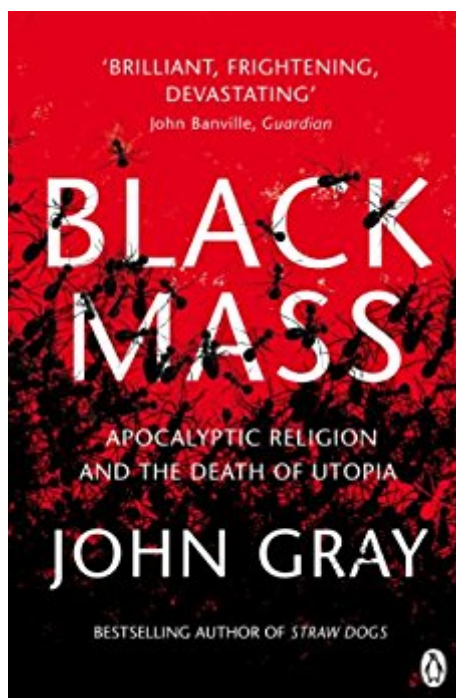

I found John Grey's book after reading his review of Fukuyama's new book. It explains that liberalism and Marxism are both utopian faith-based projects of the Enlightenment and the expectations of progress to a better world whether by Washington consensus, revolution, ethnic cleansing, or jihad. Now I understand why ISIS has less to do with Islam and more as a consequence of political decisions and trends in the West.

Like all books by John Gray, Black Mass is a compelling example of the power of an overwhelming and logical examination of vital events. At this point, I would classify Mr. Gray as one of the five top philosophers in the English language. In addition to the impeccable quality of his reasoning, he writes in an accessible and beautiful English, without all the word-splitting typical of philosophers, particularly of the French breed. Kudos!
