

Oyvind Flatnes is several times the Norwegian and Nordic black powder shooting champion. He has previously published a book about black powder shooting and is a regular contributor of history and firearms articles to magazines and books.

This is a really great book, well written and illustrated. I'm a fairly knowledgeable shooter and in the past spent about three years exclusively researching and shooting 19th century black powder weaponry. In reading Mr. Flatnes' book I came to realize the many gaps in my knowledge.
